#### **Giant Panda**

High in dense bamboo forests in the misty, rainy mountains of southwestern China lives one of the world's rarest mammals: the giant panda, also called the panda. Only about 1,500 of these black-and-white relatives of bears survive in the wild.

COMMON NAME: Giant Panda

SCIENTIFIC NAME: Ailuropoda melanoleuca

TYPE: Mammals

DIET: Omnivore

AVERAGE LIFE SPAN IN THE WILD: 20 years

SIZE: 4 to 5 feet

WEIGHT: 300 pounds

Pandas eat almost nothing but bamboo shoots and leaves.

Occasionally they eat other vegetation, fish, or small animals, but bamboo accounts for 99 percent of their diets. Pandas eat fast, they eat a lot, and they spend about 12 hours a day doing it. The reason: They digest only about a fifth of what they eat. Overall, bamboo is not very nutritious. To stay healthy, they have to eat a lot—up to 15 percent of their body weight in 12 hours—so they eat fast.
